

WAE Field & 3D Workshop – Report

"Great initiative, good workshop, fantastic food, fabulous people!" (Feedback from a participant)

The first time ever WAE organized a workshop for Continental and International Judges to train a special skill – Field & 3D. Well organized by the WAE Judges Committee and Christoph Pezet from the Archery Club Les Archers de la Sallanches, 14 judges came to Sallanches in France from October, $19^{th} - 20^{th}$ 2019 to participate in the workshop. It was a mix of judges with a lot of experience and beginners also.

The main part of the workshop referred to the theoretical background and was lectured in the seminar room. The presentations were following all stages of a competition starting with the Field- and Equipment-Inspection, followed by the Qualification Round to Eliminations and Finals for individuals and teams.

It was a mix of rules, examples and best practice information. For the Field-Inspection I provided checklists and explained in detail how to use them.

Adequate space was given to discussions in order to find answers and solutions for the many questions that had been prepared by the participants.

Sometimes there could not be found a satisfying solution based on existing WA Rules. Concerning these cases, we are preparing a list with questions that will be presented to the WA Judges Committee asking for clarification. Moreover, proposals to solve these problems will also be given.


The practice session took place at the shooting range of the Archery Club in Sallanches. Christoph Pezet had prepared some animal targets to practice the Field Inspection. We also could show the specifics of an Instinctive Bow and a Longbow for the Equipment Inspection. Finally, David Catalan gave instructions how to use highly developed range-finders to control the distances.
